This includes services from identifying options for those fearing return to their home countries, to filing applications based on certain family relationships with United States citizens or residents. Our programs also include assisting with translation of civil documents, filing guardianship applications, applying for relief from medical bills.

NewBridges provides immigration legal services from Frederick County to Rockbridge County. Our supporters include private donors, houses of worship, local municipalities, and Community Foundations.
